

Steps To Success

...to substantially lower your HOA's Santee Cooper monthly bill

1. Find a recent monthly statement from Santee Cooper:
 - A. What's the combined monthly rental fee for your HOA/POA street **lights** and **poles**?
 - B. What's the monthly energy cost to light them? (A separate line item)
 - C. For how many poles and light fixtures are you being charged?
2. Determine, (if applicable) how much longer your HOA/POA is under obligation to continue your contract with Santee Cooper. (Typically 3-5 years, based on type of poles and fixtures installed. Note the date(s) of your "Outdoor Lighting Agreements/Service Requests".
3. After the initial contract period has been met, another document then governs the "contract". **Obtain/carefully read the following 8-page document, (which includes Schedules A & B):**
